 - **Dash (—):** Used to create a strong break in a sentence, often to add emphasis or an explanation. For example: "She was late—again."
 - **Hyphen (-):** Used to join words or parts of words together, like in compound words. For example: "well-known author."
 - **Brackets ([]):** Used to add extra information or clarification within a sentence. For example: "He finally answered [after taking a long pause]."
 - **Thought Mark (—):** Also known as an em dash, it's used similarly to a dash but often indicates a pause or a shift in thought. For example: "I was going to tell you—oh, never mind."
